# 1. Number of new graduates from all programs:

BScN: graduated 63 on May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2014

## 2. Accreditation information:

Underwent Full Accreditation Review (Pathway B) for the first time in January, 2014. Awaiting report which is expected in early July, 2014.

# 3. Special projects (e.g. international, nursing education):

The province is undergoing a provincial education review and is seeking stakeholder input from several areas. Willena Nemeth, Director of the CBU Nursing Program, sits on the steering committee for this. Several of our department members and students recently took part in one of these sessions. It is strongly possible CBU will be considered for a fast track program for LPN-BScN in the near future; consideration of increasing numbers is also possible.

#### 4. New programs:

No new programs this year but have been making small curriculum changes as we move along; for example: reducing 2 (3) credit nutrition courses to 1 (3) credit nutring course and introducing in its place a (3) credit English course.

For the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row, students write a final comprehensive exam in their last nursing course which is a 9 week preceptored experience in the practice setting of their choice. Results are very good and our RN pass rates have improved with this initiative.

### 5. Full time new employees including names, PhD's, tenure track or contract:

Dr. Ashlee Cunsolo Willox, Assistant Professor, Community Health Tier 11 Canada Research Chair in the determinants of healthy communities. She is cross-appointed with the Indigenous Studies Department.
